## **Acton Bridge Parish Council News**

The new parish council website has now gone live. It has the same address www.actonbridgeparishcouncil.org but we hope it is much easier to find the information you want. Formal documents including details and minutes of all parish council meetings are published on the website as well as other information which we think will be of interest to members of the village.

Following the success of the Spring Clean Day in March we have decided decided to hold a similar day in the autumn. This will take place on Saturday 11th October and more details will be issued closer to the event. It would be great to see a good number of people again take part in this event to get the village ready for winter.

Shortly before the last Parish Council meeting, details of the initial CWAC consultation on forming a new Local Plan came through. The Local Plan defines the land within CWAC which is available for building. In response to the policies of the national government, CWAC has to provide a much greater amount of land for building houses. The consultation suggests some of the options may have implications for Acton Bridge.

The Parish Council is keen to hear your views so please complete and survey questionnaire which is also referenced on page 4 overleaf.

We have also arranged a meeting with a CWAC planning officer for Wednesday 13th August at 7.00pm at the Parish Rooms.

David Hall has decided to stand down as a Parish Councillor after many years of service. We want to thank David for all his work. This means that the Parish Council is looking to co-opt a new Parish Councillor.

Your commitment is to attend the Parish Council meetings which are usually held on the first Monday evening of each month and last about 90 minutes. It gives you the opportunity to contribute to village life and have a say on some of the decisions affecting the village. 





The committee now only has 5 members, due to personal circumstances such as health /family commitments all were unavailable to organise and run the show in August 2025.


